Collection for Ukraine

On behalf of a group of Ukrainian, English and Polish volunteers working together to help Ukraine by sending regular transports to Ukraine – I'd like to kindly ask you for your support.

We send transport to Ukraine almost every week with much needed items such as:

- General medical items (painkillers, anti-inflammatories, first aid, antiseptic etc)
- Food canned or dry / non-perishable food, energy bars etc
- Baby items tins / jars of baby food, nappies, baby milk powder / sterilising tablets
- Basic toiletries and feminine hygiene products
- Dioralyte / multivitamins
- Water purification tabs
- Candles / torches / head torches and batteries

The amazing group of volunteers is based at the warehouse in: Blakelands, 50 Tanners Drive.
