PSHE

During the month of November we supported Anti-Bullying week. We started the week with an odd socks day to celebrate that we are all unique and different, we remembered that this makes us special. During the week the children also learned about who to approach if they felt they were being bullied or if a friend was being bullied. All the children understand that being bullied is not ok and we must "make a noise" about it by telling an adult who can help. We remind the children on a daily basis that if something is happening to them at school they should tell an adult straight away (even if it is not bullying) so we can support the situation.

News from Nursery

We were very happy to have so many visitors for our Christmas Stay and Play. The children really enjoyed showing their parents how well they say their morning prayers and then they made some beautiful Christmas decorations.

We were also incredibly proud of how well the children performed in their 'Wriggly Nativity'. We hope you enjoyed watching the children perform.

In Nursery we have been learning the story of the very first Christmas. Children loved to hear about Mary being told the news from Angel Gabriel and how shocked she might have been. We have really enjoyed listening to the story from the Bible and we have been talking a lot about waiting, just as Mary had to do all those years ago.









News from Year 1

In year one we learned about one of our British Values which is to have respect and tolerance to those of another faith or culture. We listened to the story of Diwali and understood how Hindu's celebrate Diwali. We made our own Diyas (lamps lit on Diwali) using card and a folding technique.

As part of our Design and Technology work, we have been learning about finger puppets. We learned about what they are through playing with them, we also designed and made prototypes before making our final version. We had to use a variety of materials and tools when making our finger puppets. We had lots of fun during our learning. Once we had made our puppets, we evaluated them and even had our own puppet show with a group of friends in class.

During our Advent term the children have also worked extremely hard when learning songs and lines for our performance of the Nativity. We are extremely proud of all the children's efforts.

Some highlights of the term also include meeting Santa and enjoying the school disco.

Thank you all for your continued support at home with your child's homework and phonics learning, it makes a massive difference to their learning. We hope you all have a well deserved break with your children and we look forward to seeing you all again in January.









Year 2 & 3's Stay and Pray was all about Prayer – the children shared their ideas about prayer as well as sharing some of their own prayers. They did some fantastic singing and it was enjoyed by all.



As part of our science topic on forces, we investigated which was easier to pick up with chopsticks; Ice Cubes or Sugar Cubes? We learnt that Sugar Cubes were easier as we all managed to pick up more in one minute than ice-cubes. Friction helped us grip the sugar cube with the chopsticks.







In Design and Technology we made marble runs. Year 2 considered features such as different levels and cup catchers and year 3 progressed onto thinking about the speed the marble would travel, using their scientific knowledge about high and low friction.







The children in Year 4 have been carrying out investigations to discover which liquids are harmful to eggshells. They then thought about how some of the liquids are also harmful to their teeth. By observing the eggshells, they came to the conclusion that the best liquid to be drinking all day is plain water and definitely not squash or coke. They also discovered that it was better to drink plain water before going to bed rather than milk.
