




Half term maths challenge!

Answers:

What a brilliant start to 2024 the year one children have had. We had our first day back as a topic day where the children enjoyed dressing up as royalty. The children wore fancy clothes and made crowns in school. We have really got stuck into our topic this half term learning all about previous queens and all the different changes that have happened over time. We have also had many children complete Purple Mash homework on creating their own palaces, which was fantastic.

As part of our PSHE we have been learning about healthy and unhealthy food and drink choices. We have discussed how these can impact our mental and physical health too. We encourage all the children to make healthy food and drink choices now which will lead to good habits in the future.

In English we have been learning about question words and questions. When reading with your children you can ask them questions about what they have read or see if they can spot question words or question marks in books that you share together, this will be a great way to support their learning in school.





Science

In science we have been learning about plants. We have been exploring the different parts of a plant and what jobs they do. We investigated what would happen if celery was put in water that had food colouring in it. We had fantastic results, showing that the stem sucks up the water which travelled to the leaves and turned them a pink/blue and purple.



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Maths

In our Maths lessons we carried out a data investigation. In small groups the children decided on their survey topic, carried out the survey, completed tally charts, bar charts and wrote statements about the data. The children presented them brilliantly on posters.

WWII

In Literacy and History we have been learning about World War 2. We have linked our art lessons experimenting with blending and defining keywords such as background, foreground and silhouette.



Year 5 children had a fantastic trip to The National Space Centre in Leicester. They enjoyed themselves thoroughly and their behaviour was a credit to St. Monicas! Following on with our Space topic we have been carrying out practical lessons, investigating the distance of planets from the sun. We have also been continuing our space topic in Art this week by looking at Peter Thorpe's abstract art where the children have produced beautiful abstract backgrounds with

space themed pictures.







Smoothie tasting and review writing

As part of their literacy work this half term, children got to taste 4 different smoothies and for extended writing wrote a review on one. While tasting the smoothies the children had to think and note down key information including: the appearance, taste, texture, flavours and value for money.





Making blood- we have been looking at the circulatory system in science this half term and children were able to 'make' some blood. The mini marshmallows are the white blood cells; the cereals are the red blood cells; water is the plasma; and the pom poms are the platelets. This was a great way for children to 'see' the different parts of blood.





On Friday 26th January, Olly, a seminarian priest from St Augustine's came to speak to the year 6 children about his calling to his vocation- one of our previous RE topics. He asked the children to think about what their vocation might be.

The Treehouse









The children in the Treehouse have settled in well to their new classroom and outdoor garden space, they particularly enjoy throwing the balls onto the target and using the slide.

This half term, in our Literacy learning, we have looked at a variety of texts both in written format and more multi-sensory. A particular favourite with the children has been the story of Cinderella. They liked role playing with the Cinderella story props in the tuff tray, especially pressing the button on the musical castle and putting Cinderella in her carriage.

In Maths we continue to listen to a variety of counting songs to support all children's understanding of number. We have been recognising numerals and trying to count in sequence, some children have also been looking at number bonds to 5 and 10. Children have also been learning about shapes. Using a variety of 2D shapes to hold and manipulate, they have been supported to recognise and name circle, triangle, square and rectangle. They have also used 2D shapes to make space rockets.
